Bible Study 32 – Acts 9:26-31 – Paul preaches Christ in Jerusalem

And when he had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples. And they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. 27 But Barnabas took him and brought him to the apostles and declared to them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who spoke to him, and how at Damascus he had preached boldly in the name of Jesus. 28 So he went in and out among them at Jerusalem, preaching boldly in the name of the Lord. 29 And he spoke and disputed against the Hellenists.[c] But they were seeking to kill him. 30 And when the brothers learned this, they brought him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus. 31 So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace and was being built up. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it multiplied.

- 4. Paul's resolute advocacy and defence of the gospel again endangered his life: 29 And he spoke and disputed against the Hellenists. But they were seeking to kill him. 30 And when the brothers learned this, they brought him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus.
- a) Paul engaged with opponents of Christ's gospel...
- b) Paul enraged opponents of Christ's gospel...
- c) Paul again escapes the murderous intentions of certain opponents of Christ's gospel...
- 5. Despite the rancorous opposition to Christ's gospel and his followers, the church enjoyed grace and growth: 31 So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace and was being built up. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it multiplied.
- a) The church continued to grow despite vehement and vociferous opposition...
- b) The church continued to glorify God in worship, work, and witness...
- c) The church continued in the blessing of God's grace for conviction, confidence, and comfort...
